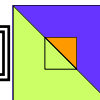
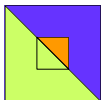

Drop in and visit sometime...the more the merrier!

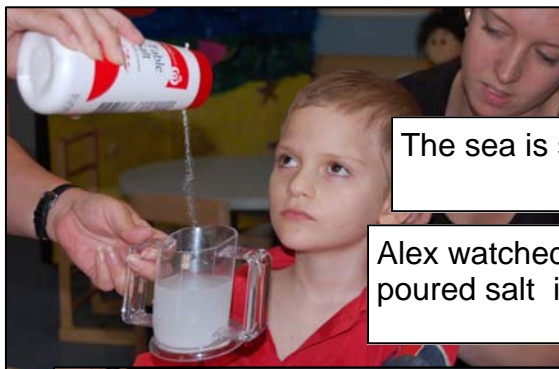


Room 7

Room 7 have been enjoying making lots of different juices in our classroom! Here we are making apple, carrot, celery and ginger juice. It was YUMMY!

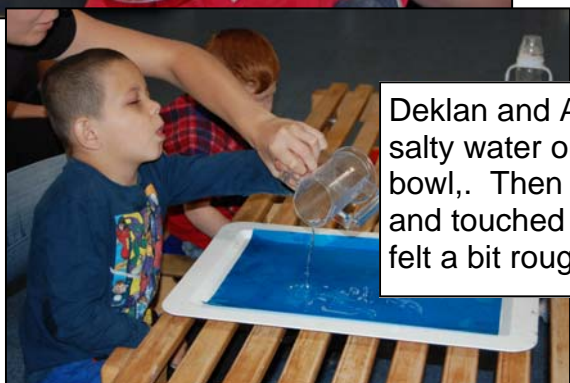


Redgum's topic has been "Under The Sea". We have discovered a lot through play such as.....



The sea is salty

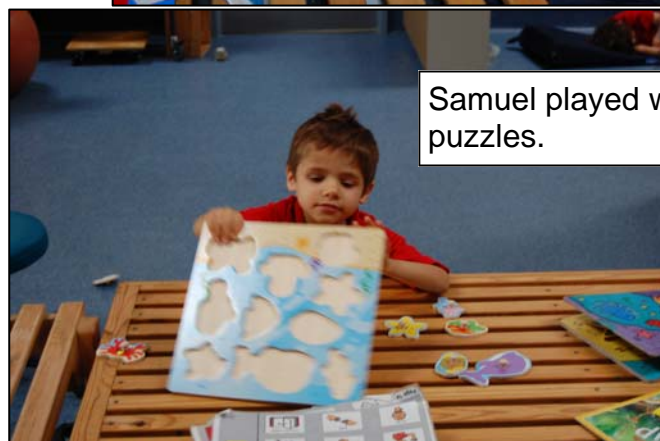
Alex watched as we poured salt into a cup.
