



Sister John Jones Academic Scholarship

Professed on 19 November 1890, Sister John (Rose) Jones was the first ever postulant to enter the Presentation community in Hay, NSW. She was a foundation member of the Western Australian congregation in Southern Cross in 1900 and also helped establish Iona Presentation Convent and school. Sister John was a well-educated, versatile and enthusiastic teacher who had a calm and reserved manner. She was appointed Mother Superior of the Perth Presentation congregation in 1915 and held this position until 1922, retiring three years later aged in her late 80s. Sister John passed away on 1 February 1930, in her fortieth year of service to the Presentation congregation.

A minimum of one scholarship is available for a student entering Year 10.

Scholarship recipients must meet the following criteria:

- An outstanding academic record and provide copies of reports with an application form to validate performance;
- A willingness to actively contribute to College life through its academic, pastoral, spiritual and creative arts programs;
- Contribute to the co-curricular program in the College, whilst holding the scholarship;
- Ability to adhere and uphold the ethos of the College; and
- Ability to attend the Iona Presentation College examination on Saturday 26 March 2011.
- Maintain academic performance and record whilst holding the scholarship.

The scholarships can be either Full or Half Scholarships. Full scholarships offer a remission of 50% of the College tuition fees, whilst Half Scholarships offer a 25% remission of College tuition fees. The incoming Year 10 recipient's scholarship is tenable for three years.

The selection process will consist of completion of the application package, payment of \$95.00 application fee and attendance at the Iona Presentation College examination. Based on the results from the exam, selected candidates will be invited to attend an interview to assist in final selection.

The scholarship is subject to an annual review and monitoring throughout the year. The scholarship can be withdrawn if requirements are not met.
