TUITION FEE, FACILITY FEE, COURSEWORK FEES and ICT LEVY

The Tuition Fee covers the ongoing teaching, support and administration staffing costs at the College. The Facility Fee covers the provision and maintenance of buildings, furniture and equipment, utilities such as power and water, and the servicing of capital development loans. Both Fees can be paid by one of four payment options (see Payment Options).

The annual Coursework Fee covers the cost of many incidentals and consumables, such as textbooks and workbooks not on the booklist, audiovisual and library services, the College Planner, entry into sporting carnivals, Reflection Days, consumables for the Subject Electives, competitions in Science and Mathematics, safety glasses, Student Council fee, and Students Personal Accident and Disability Insurance Scheme. This fee does not cover weekend sporting fees, social events, and optional excursions in some subjects. All students will be given an initial credit of \$10 for use of the College printers, but will need to pay for all printing beyond this limit. They will be able to purchase credits from the College Library. Loss of a textbook will incur a fee equal to its replacement cost. The College subsidises 50% of the cost of INSTEP Plus. These fees are non refundable once class lists have been determined. The ICT Levy covers the provision of a notebook computer to students in Years 7 to 10, including warranty and loss/damage insurance (\$250 excess payable by parents).

Coursework Fees and the ICT Levy are billed once a year once class lists have been determined and are non refundable in the event a student changes subjects or leaves the College. This is due to the allocation of resources based on student numbers enrolled for subjects at the start of each year.

APPLICATION FEE FOR ADMISSION (GST INCLUSIVE)

A non refundable fee of \$120 is payable to commence the enrolment process and is designed to cover administration costs associated with enrolment. The fee should be paid upon submission of the Application for Enrolment form. This fee does not guarantee an interview or a place at the College. ENROLMENT CONFIRMING FEE (NO GST APPLIES)

A non refundable confirming fee of \$750 must be paid on acceptance of an offer for your daughter's place at the College. This must be submitted with the College Day/Boarding Admission Form within two weeks following an offer of a place to confirm registration. Should this not occur within the specified time, the offer will expire.

PAYMENT OPTIONS

Option 1

Payment of fees in one instalment in advance. The payment is due and payable by 4 February 2011. Parents using this option will qualify for a 3% discount on tuition fees only. This option is available via BPay, direct debit from bank accounts using the Direct Debit Scheme or by providing the College with your credit card details for automatic payment by 4 February 2011. In addition, payment may be made by cash, cheque or by direct deposit into the College bank account. Please note that families who have received a Scholarship or Nano Nagle Bursary are not eligible to receive the 3% discount.

Option 2

Payment of fees in three (3) instalments, due on 25 February, 25 May and 25 August 2011. This option is available via direct debit from bank accounts using the Direct Debit Scheme or by providing the College with your credit card details for automatic payment on the dates specified. In addition, payment may be made by cash, BPay or cheque.

Option 3

Payment of fees in nine (9) equal instalments, due on 25th of each month from February through to October 2011. This option is only available via Direct Debit from bank accounts using Direct Debit Scheme or by providing the College with your credit card details for automatic payment on dates specified.

Option 4

Payment of fees in eighteen (18) equal instalments, due on the 10th and 25th of each month from February through to October 2011. This option is only available via direct debit from bank accounts using the Direct Debit Scheme or by providing the College with your credit card details for automatic payment on dates specified.

SIBLING DISCOUNT

A reduction of 10% is allowed on the Tuition Fees for the second child and 20% for subsequent children. All other costs must be paid in full.

SPLIT BILLING

Families who wish to split their account equally between two parties must provide written advice to the College, signed by both parties, authorising the account to be divided equally. The authority should be returned to the Finance Office by 4 February 2011.

FEES NOT PAID

The College Board reserves the right to take legal action for the recovery of fees not paid. Any expenses, costs or disbursements incurred by the College in recovering any outstanding monies, including debt collection agency fees and solicitor costs shall be charged to the account. Continuance of enrolment cannot be guaranteed unless all outstanding fees and charges have been paid or an arrangement has been made with the Principal. Any accounts not paid using the above options by the due date will incur an account administration fee of \$25 per month (or part thereof) until paid.

OPTIONAL EXCURSIONS

Students will not be eligible to participate in optional excursions unless all tuition fees and other compulsory charges are fully paid or are up-to-date as per payment options 1 to 4.

COLLEGE BUILDING, LIBRARY AND SCHOLARSHIP FUNDS CONTRIBUTIONS

The College runs a voluntary Annual Giving Program, administered by the College's Community Relations and Development Office. The Annual Giving Program enables parents to make tax deductible voluntary donations to the College Building projects, Library Fund and scholarship program.

SPECIAL FEE PAYMENT ARRANGEMENTS

FINANCIAL SUPPORT

Any parent in genuine financial hardship may obtain a Nano Nagle Bursary form from the College Accounts Office. There are various criteria applicable for the assessment of these applications. Parents are informed in writing of the outcome of their assessment. Parents are required to re-apply for consideration on an annual basis. Current Nano Nagle Bursary recipients must re-apply prior to 25 February 2011.

Secondary Assistance Scheme

The Minister for Education has currently approved the following Educational Program: Years 8 to 12 (\$235) plus clothing allowance (\$115). Eligibility for the scheme is dependent on parents or legal guardians holding one of the following cards: Centrelink Family Health Care card, Centrelink Pensioner Concession card or Veterans' Affairs Pensioner card. The Allowance is paid up to and including the year the student turns seventeen years of age. Application forms are available from the Finance Office. GOODS AND SERVICES TAX

Education in general is GST free. Some charges are, however, taxable.

FEE REVIEW DATE

All fees are reviewed annually for the commencement of the new school year.

INSURANCE

It is strongly recommended that parents check their health and general insurance policies to ensure adequate medical, personal property and liability insurance cover. Students at the College are covered by the Catholic Church Insurance Students Accident Insurance Policy. This policy provides a limited cover only (excluding all Medicare services including the Medicare gap). STUDENT WITHDRAWAL

Notice of withdrawal must be given in writing to the Principal. Verbal notification is not considered due notice.

Day Student

Due notice of the withdrawal of a day student requires a full term's notice in writing to the Principal. If due notice is not provided, one term of the current annual tuition fee must be paid.

Boarding Student

Boarding students are expected to remain as boarders for the full year. Due notice of a student's withdrawal from the Boarding Community requires a full semester's notice in writing to the Principal. If due notice is not provided, one semester's fee is payable. There will be no refunds for Year 12 boarders withdrawing in Term 4.
