

# GREENLINK WALK

## A new coastal walk around Long Reef headland and Griffith Park

This new four kilometre (one hour) scenic walk will take you across Griffith Park through She-oak woodland, dune habitat, heathland and restored coastal grasslands. Throughout the walk you will also have superb coastal views of rolling surf breaking over the rock platform.

You can observe local birds in their natural habitat, such as Superb Fairy Wrens, Eagles and Kestrels. In summer, migratory water birds visit Long Reef Point rock platform. Lizards, and grasshoppers in the native grasslands will also keep you occupied around the Walk.

With its scenic, natural, environmental, educational and recreational values, the park provides an outstanding resource of regional significance that is highly valued by the local community and visitors alike.

Northern Beaches Envirolink Inc. (NBE) will undertake further habitat development in 2003.

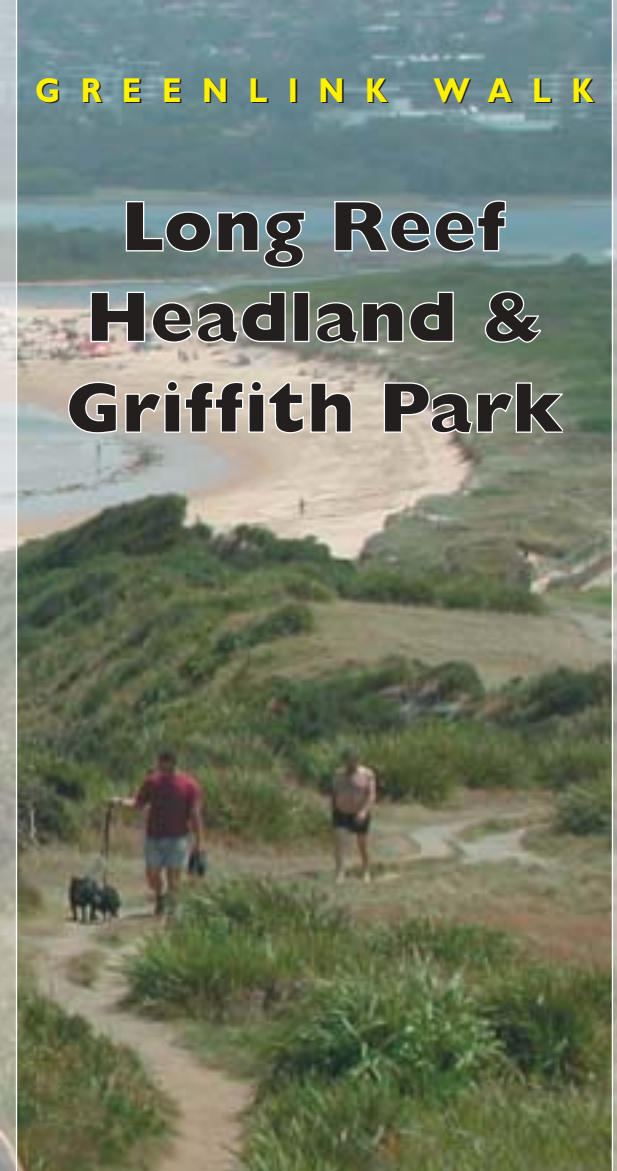

## Map Key

- 1** Long Reef Aquatic Reserve, including beaches and rock platform; no dogs allowed
- 2** Car park – metered and disabled access to headland
- 3** Fisherman's Beach boat ramp, aquatic reserve, information display and toilets
- 4** Toilets
- 5** Griffith Park – free parking
- 6** Unleashed dog exercise area
- 7** Long Reef Point – restored grasslands
- 8** Headland lookout, drinking fountain and whale sculpture
- 9** Board walk/bridge over stream
- 10** Sand dunes – nature trail and flowering beach plants
- 11** Long Reef Surf Club, toilets, picnic area, BBQ facilities and metered car park
- 12** She-oak woodland; follow yellow path
